The last eleven months have had a lasting impact on all of us. It has stretched us and raised many questions about our lives. We have all been afraid for our own lives and the lives of our loved ones. For me, one question has been: is God still with us on our journey? What are the signs of that?

The Bible is very clear that God is love. In my experience, wherever love is present in the world, it is a sign of God's Spirit. That love is present in the world in many forms beyond the obvious ones of a parent's love for their child. In the last eleven months I have been witness to that love in the community of L'Arche Winnipeg.

As it states in another place in this newsletter Dorothy Baxter, a long time resident of L'Arche Winnipeg, passed away on December 31st, 2020 at the age of 84. In the weeks leading up to her death, I was deeply touched by the love and care for her expressed to her by the members of her home, her sister and nieces, and many others within L'Arche who were friends of hers. She was the life of the party and will be missed by many people. I have known Dorothy for over 46 years and it has been wonderful to see her grow in confidence during that time. I believe she knew deep within her soul that God loved her as she was.

As we prepare for our Virtual Walk with L'Arche we remain grateful for the faithfulness and love shown by our supporters in last year's walk and in the recently completed Christmas Appeal. Your support has helped with many things including two bathroom renovations to make them accessible for our aging members, which allows them to stay in their homes.

By the love and concern for others shown by our assistants and other workers, we have managed not to have any cases of Covid-19 in our homes. The live-in assistants have sacrificed a lot and not gone out to visit family or

Remembering Dorothy



The year 2020 ended on a sad note as we mourned the passing of a long-term member of L'Arche, Dorothy, who died on December 31st from pneumonia complications. She was 84 years old.

The relative quickness of her passing, during code red pandemic restrictions, meant that few people had the opportunity to visit her and say their goodbyes, and only five people were allowed to attend her funeral service. L'Arche organized an online Zoom memorial service on January 27th for family and friends of Dorothy. Many people were present and had the opportunity to share stories and special memories of Dorothy, We looked at pictures of her life and listened to some of her favorite songs. Amongst the many tributes, certain words were often repeated - "gratitude" being the main one. The words "Thank-you" were often on Dorothy's lips, as she was very appreciative of everything that people did for her and with her. People remembered many of her say-

Her "hello, stranger!" was a subtle reminder that you had not visited her for a long time. Dorothy liked to be involved in people's lives, and always wanted to be of service, to help out wherever she could (she spent many hours stamping & stuffing envelopes for the mail-

out of our newsletter!). She loved visiting family, especially her sister Val, and going on outings. She had the opportunity to go on pilgrimages to Rome and Lourdes with Faith and Light, to visit her friend Eileen in Australia, and to go on several Caribbean cruises.

Dorothy joined our community in 1974 and lived in several different houses over the years, and spent the last 17 years living at our *Dayspring* home.

For our core members who love to go out into the broader community to interact with people including other customers, cashiers, and waitresses at our L'Arche Tova Café, it has been a challenge. I think it is probably because they intuitively understand that the most important aspect of life is relationships, friendships, if you like, love. They are living with people who love them and whom they love and so life in the isolation of their home is more than bearable.




Getting the flu shot last fall

We have heard from the province of Manitoba that all our assistants and workers in the homes will be eligible to be vaccinated for Covid in the next two months. While we are waiting for clarification, it appears that our core members will also be eligible to be vaccinated during that period as well. Hopefully, sometime in the months following that, we will have the opportunity to get together at a community gathering, face to face. I can't imagine how exciting and wonderful a celebration that will be!

In September I will turn seventy, and as my four year mandate as community leader is up in December, I will be retiring from this role by the end of the year. For me the last 11 years have been a real gift of spiritual growth and I have been privileged to witness to God's love and presence in L'Arche Winnipeg.
