New Community Leader for L'Arche Winnipeg!

After a thorough application and interview process and prayerful discernment, we are very happy to announce that the Board of Directors of L'Arche Winnipeg have accepted the recommendation of the Selection Committee.

They have appointed **Dominic Opaka** as the new Community Leader/Executive Director for L'Arche Winnipeg for the next mandate, January 1, 2022 - Dec 31, 2025. We believe that Dominic will bring the following qualities and attributes to this role:

- Personal core values that are aligned with the core values of L'Arche: the Identity and Mission, Servant leadership, spirituality of L'Arche and lived relationships with core members.
- Ten years experience of the day -to-day operations of a L'Arche community (L'Arche Edinburgh, and L'Arche Edmonton) gained from various roles, that range from live-in house assistant, to House Leader and Homes Coordinator.
- A collaborative leadership style based on deep listening, transparency, and leading from within the circle.
- An openness to continuous learning and personal growth.
- An understanding of the expectations of the role of Community Leader, and a commitment to achieving the intended outcomes of the new Community Mandate.

On a more personal note, Dominic grew up in Kenya and moved to L'Arche Edmonton a little more than three years ago. He is excited about this new opportunity in his L'Arche journey and about moving with his wife to Winnipeg and discovering another Canadian city.

We are grateful to Dominic for his "yes" and are committed to support him and the community in this time of transition and renewal. Dominic will begin December 6th with a time of

transition with Jim Lapp and take on the full leadership at the end of the December.

We trust that you will all extend a warm welcome to Dominic and that he can count on everyone to support him to lead the Community through the next four years.

Thank-you to all for your prayers during this process and especially as this new chapter in the community unfolds.

From 2019 to last May, I was the Events & Social Media Coordinator for L'Arche Winnipeg. When Diane Truderung announced her retirement, I decided to apply for the position. I felt inspired by her outstanding work, and I thought I could put my skills and experience to service for an even greater cause.

My journey with L'Arche began over a decade ago. I first heard about L'Arche from a friend at university back in Brazil. He had just returned from L'Arche London, in the UK and shared his unique experience with that community. I immediately felt a connection. Shortly after graduating in 2006, I went to L'Arche Dublin for a one-year volunteer term in Ireland. From live-in assistant to House Leader to fundraising video producer, my experience was so wonderful that the one-year commitment turned into three. I made friends, learned new skills, and felt transformed by sharing my life with people with intellectual disabilities.

I left L'Arche Ireland in 2009, but L'Arche never left my heart. In 2011, I arrived in Winnipeg for another one-year volunteer term. Once again, that one-year commitment stretched to several. From 2014 to 2019, I decided to pursue further education in communications. I also acquired valuable experience in communications, marketing, photography, videography, and new media. in 2019, I was equipped with a skill set that allowed me to contribute to the community in new ways.

In this new role, I am happy for the

opportunity to serve L'Arche by applying my knowledge in Communications and Fundraising in a way that we can fulfill our mission to make known the gifts of people with disabilities.

Funds raised will be divided equally: 50% to the L'Arche community, 50% to L'Arche International's **Solidarity** program, which supports L'Arche communities in countries where there is little or no government funding available.
