Mentoring Each Other at the L'Arche Tova Cafe

Every Wednesday, Murray and Holli volunteer together at the café. They arrive at around 8:45, greeting each other with a smile and a hug. As customers enter, they work together to greet and seat them: "Welcome to the L'Arche Tova Café! Our names are Murray and Holli, we volunteer together on Wednesdays and mentor each-other. Can we get you started with anything to drink?"

If you order coffee, Murray will come pour you a cup while Holli brings over the cream. Once you're finished eating, they work together to clean your table -Murray clears away the dishes and Holli wipes down the table, before setting new place settings for their next guests. The two

"We can all learn from each other," says Murray, who has been volunteering with L'Arche Winnipeg for over 9 years – first as a maintenance assistant at the homes mowing lawns, clearing snow, and painting walls, and now as a serving assistant at the Tova Café for the past 3 years. He enjoys getting to know the café staff and customers, and he loves working with Holli.

Holli has been volunteering at the L'Arche Tova Café for just over a year, and she loves helping and getting to know the customers she

serves. As a long-time Transcona resident, volunteering at the cafe has helped her to feel more connected and celebrated in her home community.

The pair takes time to chat and connect with their customers, always building upon past connections with the regulars. For Murray and Holli, this is what the L'Arche Tova Café is all about: includina others and being included; supporting others while supported. As being café volunteers, Murray Holli and receive as much as they give often even more.

Experiencing Eden: Disability in the **Natural World**

Where do you see beauty? What helps you make sense of your place in the world? For many of our core members with intellectual disabilities, the answer is simple: spending time in nature.

Last month. our community gathered with local artist Danielle Fontaine Koslowsky to talk about art, beauty, and identity—what makes us who we are. We shared stories of walking through parks, of noticing flowers popping up outside, of our favorite colors like sky blue, lavender, and mango. We shared about how nature makes us feel: calm. capable, and included.

As we listened to one another, a

common theme emerged: the power of nature to reflect and reveal our shared humanity.

We each move through the world in our own unique way, and our experiences, contexts, and relationships shape how we experience the world. As humans, we are part of ecosystems - and we experience who we are as people when we engage with the natural world around us. Our relationship with nature reveals the interdependence, vulnerability, and diversity of our humanity, announcing our place in the family of things.

Through art, we share how wepeople with and without disabilities-perceive the world in beautifully different ways. Our senses bring us color, texture, scent, and sound, helping us connect to ourselves and the world around us.

Later this summer we are opening an art exhibit in celebration of that connection—of the ways experience life through beauty and joy. Join us Thursday, August 7th at le Maison des Artistes Visuels for the opening "Experiencing Eden: disability and the natural world." Through this exhibit, our core members invite you into their perspectives as people with disabilities - sharing their unique experiences of nature through touch, sight, and sound.

"I want people to feel like it's a birthday party, like it's celebration!" said Gina, one of our core members. And that's exactly what this exhibit hopes to do: to welcome you into a celebration of life, community, and shared humanity.

In the Studio Gallery, enjoy original works by L'Arche artists featuring colors, textures, and elements of the natural worldexpressed through painting, multimedia, and ceramics. These pieces reflect our community's deep connection to nature and the sensory experiences that bring us joy. In the Sensory Garden Room, step into a hands-on space inspired by the experience of walking through a park.
